BRYAN ADAMS DVD LIVE AT SLANE CASTLE BRINGS HOME COMPLETE SUMMER 2000 CONCERT IN IRELAND

An exciting and powerful performer, Bryan Adams is renowned as one of rock's best concert attractions. With straightforward rock 'n' roll, a distinctive voice, and a touch for melody and emotion, he has become one of rock's most popular and successful artists. Now Bryan Adams is brought home, in concert, for the first time on DVD. Set at the base of a historic castle in Ireland, Bryan Adams: Live At Slane Castle (A&M/UME), released December 11, 2001, brings fans a night of unforgettable rock 'n' roll.

Shot the evening of August 26, 2000, Live At Slane Castle finds Adams soaring on performances of his chart-topping hits "Heaven," "Have You Ever Really Loved A Woman?" and the triple platinum "(Everything I Do) I Do It For You" as well as the gold #2 "Can't Stop This Thing We Started," Top 10s "Run To You" and "Please Forgive Me," Top 20 "It's Only Love" and Top 40 "Cuts Like A Knife."

As always, he also puts on a spectacular show of fan favorites like "Summer of '69," "18 Til I Die" and "The Only Thing That Looks Good On Me Is You," and a good ol' fashioned blues medley of "If Ya Wanna Be Bad Ya Gotta Be Good"/"Let's Make A Night To Remember." Special guest Mel C., a.k.a. Sporty Spice, is seen and heard on "When You're Gone" (which along with "Cloud Number 9" and "Before The Night Is Over" were first heard on Adams' most recent album, 1998's On A Day Like Today). In addition, Live At Slane Castle includes renditions of "She's Only Happy When She's Dancing," "I'm Ready," "Don't Give Up," "Best Of Me," "Back To You" and "Into The Fire."

Made available only on DVD, <u>Live At Slane Castle</u> also includes backstage footage, interactive menus, interviews, a photo gallery, a revolutionary 360° camera and Dolby 5.1 Surround sound to provide the listener with a complete concert experience.

Canadian-born singer-songwriter Adams has earned an enormous global fandom. His third album, 1983's Cuts Like A Knife, proved to be his platinum Top 10 breakthrough. In 1984, the quintuple platinum #1 Reckless followed, as did the platinum Into The Fire in 1987. The 1991 movie Robin Hood: Prince Of Thieves yielded the Oscar- and Grammy-winning "(Everything I Do) I Do It For You." The quadruple platinum Waking Up The Neighbours was also released that year. His 1993 "best of" collection, So Far, So Good, went quintuple platinum. Another film, 1995's Don Juan DeMarco, brought the Oscar-nominated "Have You Ever Really Loved A Woman?" The platinum 18 Til I Die (1996) led to On A Day Like Today, for which he toured, including at a particular castle in Ireland one August night.
