HUMAN LEAGUE (EP)

With the release of their American debut album, <u>Dare</u>, the Human League brought the States one of the biggest and most significant songs of 1982 with "Don't You Want Me." The song played a major role in expanding the parameters of American radio and introduced a new and sizeable audience to a sound that middle-of-the-roaders only once joked about (electro-synthesizer Euro-Pop).

Aside from the release of an album entitled Love and Dancing that was credited to the League Unlimited Orchestra (the band's pseudonym) last August, nothing has been heard from the band until this Spring.

FASCINATION! is a specially priced EP featuring the title track (also the first single), "Mirror Man," "Hard Times," "I Love You Too Much," "You Remind Me Of Gold," and a special remix of the title. The EP was produced by Martin Rushent and the League, which remains: Philip Oakey (vocals & synthesizers), Ian Burden (synthesizers), Jo Callis (Rolland guitar & synthesizers), Joanne Catherall (vocals), Susan Sulley (vocals), and Phillip Adrian Wright (synthesizers).

The EP consists of tracks recorded in late 1982 in England. "I Love You Too Much" will be available in no other package or country except this U.S. A&M release.
